IDAHO TAX COMMISSION WEB SITE MAKES KEEPING UP TO DATE LESS TAXING

BOISE, IDAHO — July 11, 2006 — Idahoans interested in tax issues can have the most up-to-date information delivered right to their desktops. They can get e-mail notifications when new content is posted on the Idaho State Tax Commission Web site (tax.idaho.gov).

The e-mail subscription service allows Web visitors to sign up for free personal e-mail alerts on the content that interests them. By clicking the "Keep Me Updated" button on the home page or one of the many envelope icons located throughout the site, subscribers can receive updates on more than 50 items, including property tax information, brochures about sales and income tax, sales and use tax reports, news releases, proposed administrative rules, and more.

"It's a real time-saver," said Leslie Jones, Web site coordinator for the Tax Commission. "When you subscribe, you get the most current information on the topics you choose, without having to return to the Web site and check for changes.

"As our Web site expands, users will have more items to choose from," she added.

The Tax Commission launched the service last August with a limited number of options. Since then, the agency has sent more than 17,000 e-mail alerts to more than 600 subscribers.
